Redemption from Shame

We can feel shame for things we can't control. We can feel guilty even when we haven't done anything wrong. We can be manipulated by someone who is an expert at injecting feelings of shame and guilt into our minds.

At the other end of the spectrum, there are times when someone (could it be me?) doesn't feel guilty for something that really is wrong. Sometimes this is out of ignorance or out of a misguided conscience. Sometimes it is out of a seared conscience—one so often ignored and trampled on that it is no longer sensitive to guilt.

Satan, our enemy, has many ways of using these weapons against us. He wants us to feel so much shame and guilt (even when we haven't sinned) that we feel discouraged, hopeless, debilitated. He wants us to say, What's the use?

Satan also wants us to feel there's no real way out of guilt when it is deserved. He wants us to seek to justify ourselves, to get angry at those we have sinned against and at God. He wants us to seek harmful distractions, to self-medicate and to feel cutoff from God with no way back.

Or he wants us to not feel guilty—when we really should.

There is a time and right purpose for guilt. God created us with the ability to learn about right and wrong and to feel guilt for wrong. He wants the feeling of guilt for sin to lead us to change. He wants us to repent and to wash away the guilt—not to go back and wallow in it.

The Bible shows that even Jesus Christ endured undeserved shaming (Hebrews 12:2). The apostles faced times when they were shamed for serving Christ, and so they reframed their situation, "rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for His name" (Acts 5:41). Peter later wrote, "Yet if anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but let him glorify God in this matter" (1 Peter 4:16).

If we face shaming or guilt that is undeserved, what can we do?

Reminding ourselves that it is not deserved can help. Seeking wise counsel about how to deal with the person or people shaming us can also be a good idea.

And we can ask God to help us not take the unfair attacks to heart.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus gave some keys to dealing with anxieties and worries. It's a matter of focusing on godly priorities and turning our concerns over to God. This helps us to minimize our worries. Consider these instructions from Jesus:

"In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. [We give God and His Kingdom top priority.] Give us this day our daily bread. [We put our needs and cares in God's hands.]

"And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. [God alone can forgive our spiritual debt of sin.] And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one [our spiritual accuser]. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen" (Matthew 6:9-13).

"But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble" (Matthew 6:33-34).

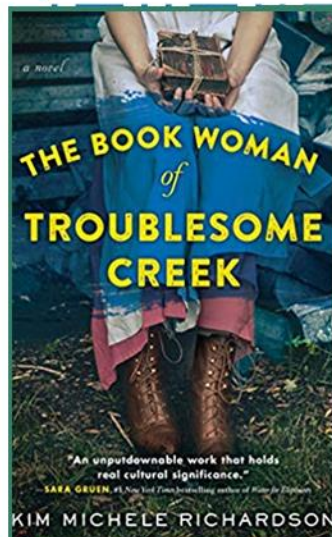

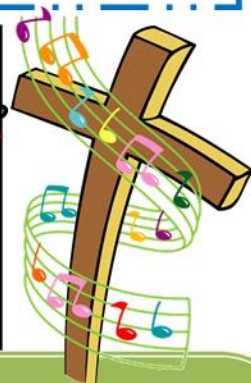

Hey all,

Lucas writing to you. What makes you mad? A few things come to mind for what makes me mad: The St. Louis Cardinals and LA Rams losing, stepping on what feels like pure glass and nails every time I step barefoot on one of the toys Amelia and/or Hadley leave on the ground, and Jake Gibbs beating me in ping pong. On a more serious note, I hate bullies. Coming from the standpoint of someone who used to be the bully and also the bullied, I hate it. It makes me mad. You may have seen a recent post I wrote on the church Facebook page that 77% of students see bullying every day in their schools. What was worse is that someone said they see bullying inside the church. Say what?! No, that can't be right. Christians don't bully anyone, especially in church. I laugh at that like I laugh at people who think nothing immoral happens on Christian University campuses. I'm not defending the phrase "people are imperfect," because I understand we all have faults and sin in our own lives. But we, as disciples of Jesus, have been called to live by a standard that is above the standard the world has set before us. We were created as a people of love, of grace, and of mercy. We were created to treat and respect all of humanity as sons and daughters of the Most High God.

All of this is brought up from books I've been reading the last few weeks. The first is called "Dignity Revolution: Standing up for the Value of Every Person" by Bob Lenz. The other is called, "What Made Jesus Mad?" by Tim Harlow. And one thing early on in Tim's book that he says made Jesus mad was God's people getting in the way of non-God-knowers coming to know Jesus and God. Read that again if it was a little fuzzy.

"Jesus was mad because of what always made him mad: denied access to His Father. Jesus' anger was directed at the Jews who turned the non-Jews' house of prayer into a market, thereby denying access, literally, to the outsiders who wanted to worship God."

I saved a quote from an Andy Stanley sermon from earlier this year: "Does your version of Christianity get in the way of loving people God loves?" That's a real honest question we need to constantly ask ourselves. One of the ways that those Jewish leaders would get in the way of "outsiders" getting to God would be to hold people to their own traditions and laws that they made up for themselves, even if they weren't from their 613 laws given by God in the Old Testament. They would put these standards on people, and if they didn't live up to them, they were seen as "lesser than." They were bullied by the religious.

A trend of people leaving the church altogether has not been because they didn't believe that God or Jesus were real or anything like that. It has been because they didn't feel the love of Jesus in those people who proclaim to follow and love Him. Some even leave because of people putting standards on them that aren't biblical at all, but tradition and personally based, just like those same Jewish leaders. And you know what? That makes Jesus mad. That makes me mad. I say it so much our students are probably already annoyed with me when I tell them how simple Christianity is (even though we make it harder than it has to be). LOVE is what we do. LOVE is all we do. LOVE is everything we do. So let's stop the bullying. Let's stop letting man made traditions and rules get in the way of treating and loving everyone with the same love that Jesus has for all of creation. When someone asks me, "What makes ECC different from any other church?" I want to answer them like this: "These people truly love like Jesus." Let's be that church community.
